



# Watering

In winter, watering once a week is sufficient. In summer, twice a week is best. Make sure no water is left at the bottom of the pot, as this can cause root rot.

Anthuriums also enjoy high humidity, spoil yours by misting the leaves every now and then.



#### Location

Anthuriums like plenty of light, but not direct sunlight. In darker spots they will produce fewer flowers. A bright place near an east- or westfacing window is ideal.



## Temperature

As a tropical plant, the Anthurium loves warmth. It thrives at normal room temperatures (18–25 °C) and does not cope well with temperatures below 15 °C.



# Flowering

With the right care and regular feeding, the Anthurium will produce new flowers all year round.

Its natural cycle is three months of flowering, followed by a short rest period, then fresh blooms again.



## Repotting

Repot your Anthurium once a year, ideally in spring. Use fresh potting compost and choose a pot that is at least 20% larger, so the plant has space to keep growing.



### Don'ts

Avoid placing the plant in a draught or directly beside a radiator. Keep it away from fruit as well, as the ethylene gas released speeds up ageing. Too much water and too little light will also reduce flowering.
